2010 SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

The Hispanic Business Association (HBA) is a non-profit organization dedicated to the improvement of educational opportunities for Hispanic students. Since 1993, the HBA has awarded over \$230,000 in scholarships to 300 students from Idaho and Eastern Oregon for the purpose of pursuing post secondary degrees.

General Guidelines

- A. Awards are made annually. The number of scholarships awarded is determined each year by the HBA's Board of Directors. Proceeds for this scholarship program come from our annual golf tournament: "The Richard G. Cortez Jalapeno Open". **Scholarship recipients will be asked to participate as a volunteer during the tournament scheduled for September of 2010.**
- B. **Recipients must enroll for a minimum of 12 credit hours** or have full-time status as an undergraduate or graduate student in an accredited post-secondary institution of higher learning.
- C. Award recipients are selected based on the following factors:
 1. Academic performance based on the most recent official transcript.
 2. Essay.
 3. Extracurricular activities/work experience, which reflect leadership, initiative, motivation, etc.
 4. Recommendations from teachers, business contacts, clergy, etc.

General Requirements

1. Academic performance, minimum eligibility of a 2.5 GPA.
2. U.S. Citizen or permanent resident for at least one year and of *Hispanic* descent.
3. **Documents to be submitted with this scholarship application:**
 - **Two letters of recommendation.**
 - **Official copy of the most recent transcript (high school or college, whichever is applicable).**
 - **List of extracurricular activities and work history in a resume format.**
 - **Essay.**
4. This essay helps us become acquainted with you in ways different from courses, grades, test scores, and other objective data. It will demonstrate your ability to organize thoughts and express yourself. We are looking for an essay that will help us know you better as a person and as a student. Please write an essay (250 – 500 words) on the topic listed below.

2009 has been a difficult year for generating funds for the HBA's scholarship program. With a reduction in available scholarship funds and an imminent increase in tuition at Idaho schools, the HBA expects a significant increase in the number of applications submitted. What can you tell us about yourself, your goals and your experiences that would increase your chance of receiving this scholarship?

5. Applications must be postmarked no later than **MARCH 1, 2010.**
